### Just Like Us talk

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### **UK China Immersion Programme**

Park Community School's international connections have continued to develop during the last two weeks of term. We have had the pleasure to host two groups of students from China, 56 visiting students in total. Park students were invited to volunteer to be buddies to our guests, with over 80 of our students in years 7, 8 and 9 requesting to be a part of the experience.

The Park students guided their Chinese partners through tutor time, lessons, Finding What You Love activities/clubs, Much More Than Just A School Carousal opportunities, school production rehearsals, a Stonehenge trip, sports events, assemblies and much more.

Each week ended with a celebration assembly. During these assemblies not only did Park students present reflection of their experiences but also several of the visiting students presented. 

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

### Year 10 Work Experience


