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### Year 7 - a strong start!

In Star Curriculum lessons, students have been studying Identity, considering who they are as individuals as well as learning about their place in the local community and the wider world. They have also undertaken their first inter tutor challenge and we saw some emerging leadership skills from all groups - well done Year 7!

#### This term:

This term's Star lessons linked to Identity have started with an RE focus, exploring what it means to be human. Students have developed their justification skills and have learnt what it means to be an effective communicator. This week, every student in Year 7 will deliver an individual presentation to their class on the subject 'Who am I?' We can't wait to see their presentation skills!

On the week of 4th November, Year 7 will complete their first Rich Challenge, applying what they have learnt to a real audience and purpose. The challenge involves capturing oral histories of both local people and figures with important links to the local community. These stories will be turned into an exhibition by Year 7.

## Performing Arts at Titchfield Theatre




Your child's attendance streaks are tracked in their planner this year. Do check it with them and help them keep track.


