Speakers for Schools – Professor Michael Kolling, Kings College

Last week we had Professor Michael Kolling from Kings College, London visit us to talk to our IT, computer science and electronics club students. He is a computer science lecturer and focuses on designing software to help students learn programming and coding.

He shared a range of different ways to practise programming and Mr Wray has already downloaded these to use in lessons. He made links to how computer games work including how the code can be changed to make the actions more complicated.

It was very clear that programming has changed over the last 20 years and he has had to evolve and develop a new range of skills. Students were able to ask a range of questions, including impact of AI on the future and which programming language is the best.

An amazing opportunity for our IT, computer science and electronics club students to learn more about programming languages and how this could lead to future careers in games programming and beyond!


















The Lion King Musical Visit


Chinese Lessons




Manmade Project


What is the Southern School Book Awards?

Held at Hurstpierpoint College Theatre, the ceremony is hosted by notable writers and illustrators and all the shortlisted authors attend, in person, to speak about their nominated book. Plus, our students then get the opportunity to meet and talk with the hosts and authors at a booksigning event after the ceremony!


