New For 2018 -



In November we met the Trustees of the FatFace Foundation who have kindly been contributing towards our MUNCH project.

In partnership, the decision was made to provide a 'Pop Up Foodbank' in our Dickinson Centre so that no one in our community need go without food at this time of year.

This project was funded by the FatFace Foundation and carried out by the Community and Facilities Team at Park Community School and volunteers from the PO9 Food Bank.

Time was tight to make this work, however the commitment of everyone meant all worked well.

The food order was staggering, with over 50,000 items ordered from Asda Stores in Havant. It was decided that there would be six different boxes given out.

Branding

The 'Pop Up Foodbank' required an identity to market it. As MUNCH has been so successful for us, we added a bit of Christmas and CHRUNCH was formed. It was a conscious decision not to market extensively because we wanted to ensure those in need locally benefited from this initiative.

Boxes were ordered, and a label created to go on each one. Over 2,000 boxes were filled and distributed.

Packing The Boxes

Students experienced what it is to work at pace, alongside lots of the FatFace Foundation staff volunteers. We are very proud of our Year 7 students and others who, throughout the three-week period helped fill boxes, taking boxes to people's cars and packing trolleys. We have received lots of positive feedback

about their assistance. The students were very caring, and many volunteered to do extra hours, commenting about the difference this was making to families they knew. Some also felt it was good for them to be able to give something back. The FatFace Foundation kindly allowed us to take over their packing line at their head office.

From experience many families known to us through the MUNCH programme are not in receipt of benefits and do work, but with home costs often experience food poverty. With MUNCH we do not operate a referral scheme, preferring

to meet the needs of everyone who asks. We do this in the knowledge there maybe some who could abuse this approach, but we would rather this than create a barrier for others.

A STATE secondary is opening its doors tomorrow to make sure hard-up kids do not miss out on Christmas dinner.

Around 60 youngsters and a similar number of parents and pensioners will get turkey and all the trimmings, funded by well-wishers and served by volunteers.

Local firms also paid for gifts and entertainment at Park Community School in Havant, Hants, which serves deprived area Lolph Park.

Head Christopher Anders said: "Christmas brings pressures for families on low incomes. On Christmas Day at least we will know they are well fed. Without it some in our community could miss out."

The school, which laid on festive dinners for all pupils on Friday too, also has award-winning initiative Munch to ensure no child is hungry

TEACHERS are seeing first-hand the results of Tory austerity. Ten years ago, food banks in schools and begging letters to parents were unheard of.

Staff are increasingly shocked by what they see in classrooms. More kids are turning up hungry and more working families are in poverty - and resources-starved schools try to pick up the pieces.

The magnificent efforts at Park Community School are heartwarming but a worrying number of children will miss out this Christmas due to austerity.

Top charities praised the efforts but the National Education Union said they highlight "a frightening level of deep-rooted poverty".

Alison Garnham, of Child Poverty Action Group, added: "We know things have got bad when it falls to schools, themselves facing cuts, to patch up the holes in the safety net."

Shadow Education Secretary Angela Rayner said: "While it is wonderful to see a school stepping up, it is a stark reminder of the state of our country under the Tories."

But Children and Families Minister Nadhim Zahawi said: "Since 2010 there are 300,000 fewer children living in absolute poverty."

Tories' gift of record poverty Festive fun 'fuels loneliness'

THE number of people who will spend Christmas in poverty is the highest since comparable records began, Labour warns.

Figures dating to 1994/1995 show there are now over 14 million classed as being in relative poverty - up 1.2 million since 2010 under Tory austerity. Shadow

Work and Pensions Secretary Margaret Greenwood said: "The Conservatives are presiding over a growing poverty crisis."

"Amber Rudd must make tackling poverty her urgent New Year's priority. She should begin by stopping the roll-out of Universal Credit."

THE festive period can amplify feelings of loneliness, says a leading doctor.

Professor Helen Stokes-Lampard, chairwoman of the Royal College of GPs, urged people to connect with friends and neighbours. She said: "Any festival can magnify feelings of being isolated. People

are vulnerable. It's darker, seasonal affective disorder amplifies this."

She added that social isolation can be as bad for health as chronic disease. The Office for National Statistics says one in 20 English adults has reported feeling lonely often or always.
